Dunoon Public School Behaviour Support and Management Plan

Overview

Dunoon Public School is committed to explicitly teaching and modelling positive behaviour and to supporting all students to be engaged with their learning. Key programs prioritised and valued by the school community are Berry Street Education Model, the Bounce back wellbeing program, smiling minds and Zones of regulation.

Promoting and reinforcing positive student behaviour and school-wide expectations

Dunoon Public School has the following school-wide rules and expectations:

- Be Safe
- Be Respectful
- Be a Learner

Dunoon Public School uses the following strategies and systems to explicitly teach, recognise and reinforce positive student behaviour and behavioural expectations:

- Class dojo rewards system
- Whole school merit system
 - 5 certificates = large merit certificate
 - o 3 large merit certificates = Principal's banner

Merit Awards

• Merit awards are issued by teachers at each weekly assembly to recognise achievement in learning. There are 3 merit awards and 1 student of the week award given at each assembly per class. 1 Aussie of the month award is given at the last assembly for each month. This award is for an overall achiever of the month.

Values Awards

 Values awards are linked to our school expectations- be Safe, Be Respectful; Be a Learner. These awards are handed out as instant recognition of students when demonstrating appropriate behaviours. These awards are then placed in a box, and 2 students are drawn out at each assembly and receive a prize.

Positive Behaviour Celebration Day:

• During terms 2 and 4, celebration days will be organised to support students who demonstrate exceptional behaviour across all areas of the school. There will be 2 days per term- weeks 5 and 10 where all students who have not had negative well-being/behaviour concerns are tracked on SENTRAL. Those students who miss out of the activities will remain supervised in the library. Parents will be notified before the activity day if children are not participating.

Detention, reflection and restorative practices
