Did you know?

Our school's socio-economic funding is based on information parents provide during the enrolment process. It is known as FOEI.





FOEI

FOEI is the best Socio-Economic Status measure for the Department to use as the basis for the allocation of resources (funding) to our school.

Identifying disadvantage

To adequately address the equity problem for students across NSW. FOEI is based on parents' <u>highest level of school education</u>, non-school <u>qualification</u> and <u>occupational status</u>.

We recognise that circumstances change and that at the time of enrolment, some parents may have been working full-time and are now part-time, have changed jobs, are unemployed or have taken on the role of a stay-at-home parent.

If you are taking your family on an extended holiday (more than 4 days), you will need to fill in an application for leave. Forms are available at the office.


















DUNOON SCHOOL AWARD SYSTEM

Most Friday mornings, we gather as a school to acknowledge the efforts of our children.

Three gold merit certificates are presented as well as a 'Student of the Week' award for each class.

During the year, children who collect **FIVE** class awards, including Merit Certificates, Student of the Week, Aussie of the Month and other individual awards, are eligible to receive a large **Gold Merit Certificate**.

THREE large Gold Merit Certificates are collected to receive the **Principal's Medal**. Once your child has collected these awards, they need to be handed into the office by Thursday morning for Friday assembly.

(Please note the students awards will be returned)






Kitchen Garden


